# **2021 Covid Nepal**

As we all know, Covid has been a global pandemic resulting in a roller coaster of infections and lockdowns as variants spread around the world. In developing countries, the vaccine programme was dependant on donations from others and for Nepal these came mostly from China, India. Sadly, supplies were erratic and first vaccines for the vulnerable were not followed up in time so offered little protection. Thankfully full vaccine and booster programmes are now in place. Though fatalities recorded due to Covid remain low in Nepal the true figure is unknown.

## **Hospital equipment**

Having funded re-usable PPE for doctors at the start of the pandemic, in May 2021 GDS were asked to fund several oxygen concentrators costing approx. £5,000 to help save lives in the small local hospital and also in rural communities.



### **Lockdowns and Schools**

Without government support for those unable to work during lockdown, many families had no access to income and became dependant on extended families and neighbours sharing resources. In order

to enable the workforce to return, schools were kept in lockdown for months at a time to help reduce the spread of Covid. The lucky ones gained some access to online learning. Others missed months of their valuable schooling.

## Food for the community



GDHEDS were approached by local social workers asking to help provide for families in desperate need of food. In total 125 families were identified and supplied with essential food parcels of rice, lentils, oil, flour etc. The team worked rapidly to access and deliver the food. Though we generally focus on long term sustainable projects, just £1,500 was enough for GDS to help in this emergency which we willingly supported.

#### **Reminiscence of GDS Trustee - Geeta**

Geeta Karmacharya (ne Shrestha) was born in Gorkha and was inspired by her late Father Mohan to be involved in the GDS Charity. Mohan was one of the founder members of the charity in 1987 and at this time there was no opportunity for further education in Gorkha after leaving school at 16. Geeta recalls when she was little; her father left his job as a School Headmaster in order to establish a college. He attended meetings at the Universities, Ministry of Education, and different embassies in Kathmandu to raise funds. As a result, the community based Drabya Shah Multiple Campus was established initially in a couple of spare rooms which then developed into multiple departments. Geeta recalls 'teachers and students in the college where I was student at the time were additionally motivated thanks to GDS volunteers'

Today the Campus is a thriving college with several hundred local students studying 'BSC' level courses. GDS sponsors 4 students selected as diligent but needing support to continue their studies.

Mohan worked for the benefit of people in Gorkha, and was Geeta's inspiration.

Geeta now works as a specialist diabetes nurse in the UK and supports those in Gorkha through valuable contributions as a Trustee of GDS.
