### **Nepal Earthquake Disaster Appeal**

On 25th April 2015 an earthquake caused devastation throughout Nepal, the effects of which will undoubtedly last for many years to come. For this small country already struggling as one of the poorest in the world, where its remote and rugged beauty and wonderful people leave a visitor overwhelmed with special memories, it is hard for us to imagine the tragedy unfolding. Our thoughts are with our friends and families in Kathmandu and Gorkha where we have worked for over 25 years and whom we have thankfully established are all safe and well.



Facebook has helped provide us with limited communication and a few photographs posted by one friend of the charity which show that the damage is not just in faraway Kathmandu.

From the limited information available to us, indications are that much of the rural area of the Gorkha District which was the epicentre for the quake, is damaged or destroyed as we are finding from friends whose family homes are gone leaving them homeless and living with neighbours.

# What happens next?

As a small charity already working with the community in Gorkha District for many years, this area will remain our focus. Until communications are repaired we really cannot assess with our team in Gorkha how we can make best use of our small contributions. However, help we will and of course the more you can help us the more we can help them.

# **Fundraising**

Just 6 days before the disaster we held a meeting to agree to fund 8 projects which had been proposed. These projects will now be on hold and money will be redirected as needed.
